


Do students have a safe way to disclose their issues in confidence? What about staff or parents that have concerns? **The answer is 'YES' at Arthur Bugler!**

her to audition for training with the school starting this


September. We wish her the best of luck in this exciting endeavor.

A special mention to Aneira, who made her promise at Brownies this evening. We celebrate this wonderful commitment and wish her a fantastic journey in the Brownie community.


