

**Safety to and from school:** We are reaching out to remind families whose children travel to school using scooters or bikes to prioritise safety during their daily commute.

**Monster Phonics – Ebook Access:** We will now be using the Monster Phonics eBook platform for children to access their home reading books. Each child's class has a unique sign-up link (this has been sent out as a separate communication this week). Please follow the links sent out for your child's class. *When signing up, please ensure you sign up with your child's name* so it is visible for their teacher to see your child's account.



Once your child has been assigned a reading level, you will have access to the ebooks. Please look to your child's Reading Record to see which book they are working on each week. It is advisable that you only read the book that has been assigned and do not read any books ahead. This will ensure that your child has had enough practice on the focus grapheme and words that they are practicing in school and will support them in working towards reading with 100% fluency. *Children will also have access to physical books as well as the ebook system.*
